

Special Council Meeting  
of the City of Greenville  
held in the Auditorium at the  
Greenville High School  
on Tuesday, July 7, 2020

Following the Executive Orders issued by Illinois Governor Pritzker and Phase 4 Restore Illinois guidelines limiting large gatherings to 50 people, the City of Greenville held a special council meeting in the Auditorium of the Greenville High School. In addition to in-person attendance, the city offered remote participation via a conference call line and livestreamed on the city's Facebook page in response to the on-going coronavirus pandemic.

**Call to Order:**

A special meeting of the Greenville City Council was called to order on Tuesday, July 7, 2020 at 7:01 p.m. by Mayor Alan Gaffner.

**Pledge:**

The pledge of allegiance to the United States flag was recited.

**Roll Call:**

Present: Mayor Alan Gaffner, Councilman Bill Carpenter, Councilman Mike Heath, and Councilman Kyle Littlefield. Councilwoman Lisa Stephens attended via the conference call line.

Also Present: City Attorney Schaufelberger, City Manager Dave Willey and City Clerk Sue Ann Nelson.

**Public Comment:**

With no comments being expressed, public input was closed.

**Police Policies and Procedures:**

Mayor Gaffner began by providing an introduction and overview of the topic and purpose of the meeting regarding police policies and procedures. Police Chief Workman and City Manager Willey

presented information on the police code of ethics, hiring process and requirements, training topics in detail, department standard of conduct, and complaints. During the presentation questions were fielded from the audience and remote participants.

Following the presentation, Mayor Gaffner presented a proposal for a special council meeting to provide a forum for topics or issues of racial importance to be shared by community residents. These topics would then be presented to a committee that would assign topics and issues to various government or organizations for response. This proactive plan would be known as “Greenville Neighbor to Neighbor”.
